

# **Executive Director**

The past few years have been quite a roller coaster for the PALS organization, and for so many others. After canceling our biggest summer ever scheduled in 2020, we transitioned to virtual and single day events to carry us through much of the pandemic and 2021. While we continue to be inspired by the strength and passion of our community, we were absolutely thrilled to return to full-week programs in 2022.

PALS has spent the past several years continuing to evaluate how we best achieve our mission. Our staff and Executive Board have worked on actualizing our 2025 Strategic Plan, building deeper partnerships and communities in every region where we hold programs. We've worked to focus our evaluations and data to better understand our

this plan. We hosted 15 programs in 2022, serving all 10 of our focus hubs. This includes the eight hubs we were serving in 2019: Philadelphia, Mid-Atlantic, New York City, New England, South, Ohio, Illinois and Northern California. This past summer we were able to launch full-week programs in our final two hubs of our strategic plan - Southern California and the Pacific Northwest. Our camps in both LA and Seattle enabled us to enhance our representation on the West Coast and identify new partnerships and opportunities.

2022 also represented a significant year of infrastructure growth and accomplishment for PALS. Through the support of a generous grant in 2020, PALS began pursuing official accreditation from the ACA (American Camping Association). This process enabled us to better understand and implement the highest quality standards in camping programs. In addition to submitting written documentation of our policies, we also hosted ACA visitors at several of our sites to confirm that PALS is able to meet these high standards at each of our program locations. We are proud to have officially received accreditation as an Inclusive Camp for all of our week-long programs across the country. We look forward to continuing to learn and grow alongside the ACA community as we build our camp programs of belonging.

Returning to full week programs also enabled PALS to

reconnect with many donors and supporters. We are so grateful for all of those who supported PALS in 2022 and

continue to be committed to our mission of inclusion and acceptance. We also want to thank all of our volunteers who join us every summer as Peers and Leaders. We know that this experience changes the lives of both those with and without Down syndrome. As one of our PALS leaders shared this year, "PALS gave me a giant piece of my life back that I didn't know was missing, I want to give that experience of finding home again to other people."

We hope you will join us in celebrating 2022. We are looking forward to an exciting 2023 as we help more and more people find their home at PALS.

**The programming is simple**—we go on trips, we try out new activities in small groups, we compete in the PALS Olympics, and we host the best dance parties you've ever seen. While the programming is simple, the rest of it is magic. Over the years we've built a commitment to this place—to this world where the boundaries of judgment, the fear of exclusion, and the stress of fitting into some pre-designed mold are gone.

Our programming centers around our week-long, overnight camps held on college campuses across the country. And we strengthen our community with The Congratulations Project, reaching out to congratulate and welcome new families of babies with Down syndrome through letters written by our participants.

While our programming continues to expand, our model stays the same. We believe in one-to-one pairings that create strong bonds and lifelong friendships. We focus on peer-to-peer relationships, trusting in young volunteer leaders to develop age appropriate programming and to be eager to enact social change. We value residential experiences recognizing that real impact comes from immersive experiences, and real change comes in the moments you least expect it. We hold specific values of who we are. We are welcoming and supportive. We are a family that is passionate and genuine, and always has fun.

PALS has shaped the lives of thousands of individuals since our first program in 2004. Half of us have Down syndrome, but all of us know the value of friendship, the thrill of being on a team, and the best place to experience summer. Together, we challenge each other to be a little better, and to see the world a little differently.








# Perspectives from Participants

## with Down syndrome on their Experiences at PALS Programs

Executive Summary by Tori Cedar

Since 2004, PALS has built programs around the US on five core values: **Genuine, Fun, Supportive, Welcoming & Passionate.** 

PALS intends to instill these five values into all aspects of its programming. In 2021, a PALS Leader completed a dissertation for Rutgers University.

### 79% of participants strongly agreed and 21% agreed

that after PALS, they felt happy (Supportive, Genuine)

#### 63% of participants strongly agreed and 37% agreed

that they are more confident in themselves because of the support received at PALS (Support, Genuine)

### 89% of participants strongly agreed and 11% agreed

that the friendships they made at PALS are very important to them (Genuine, Welcoming)

### 89% of participants strongly agreed and 11% agreed

that they would recommend PALS to a friend with Down Syndrome (Welcoming)

### 74% of participants strongly agreed and 11% agreed

that they look forward to coming back to PALS after the week has ended (Fun, Passionate)

#### 79% of participants strongly agreed and 21% agreed

that PALS helped them to be who they want to be (Genuine, Passionate)

### 79% of participants strongly agreed and 21% agreed

that they think about themselves in a more positive way because of PALS (Welcoming, Genuine)

## 75%

of the open ended responses reflected either the participants perceptions of enjoyableness or an impactful experience that brought positive change.

#### **Inclusion and Belonging**

#### Reasons to Return/Programming

"This will be my 8th or 9th time at PALS. PALS is my family, that's why I keep coming back." "I love myself. This is me. And I love everything about PALS. I'm more confident and PALS has helped me love myself more."

#### **Personal Development**

"(The) first time I went to PALS it was the first time I ever went away. PALS makes people want to grow up and move out in the future. I want that for myself in the future too. I felt loved and happy to be accepted. I felt confident."
